

# Teaching skills for teachers

## Overview

For teachers in primary, secondary or adult education who primarily teach English in their classes. The emphasis is on enhancing and improving the teacher's language awareness and teaching skills. One or two week courses are available.

- Increase range of teaching techniques.
- Understand which teaching methods are the most effective.
- Help students become more motivated and autonomous learners.
- Raise awareness of different learning needs and hone practical skills.
- Reflect on own teaching.
